Lock Your Car Doors and Windows!

The Chapel Hill Police Department reminds residents and visitors to roll up your windows, lock your doors, and hide your valuables. Summer is the top season for vehicle theft.

Officers have responded to an increase in reports of breaking and entering to vehicles in recent weeks, and a large number of those have been where car owners have left valuables in plain sight and doors unlocked.

When exiting your vehicle, take your key; don't leave it in or on your vehicle. Close and lock all windows and doors when you park. Park in well-lit areas, and never leave valuables in your vehicle — especially where they are in sight.
