

- 7. Impact on schools


PRIMARY CHANGES IN NEW CONCEPTS

Concerns Addressed in the New Concepts


- 1. Reductions in overall densities
- 2. Clearer density transitions toward existing neighborhoods
- 3. Better definitions of housing types (townhouse v. apartment v. single family v. condo/ multi-family)
- 4. Identification of "habitable" area, given amounts of land taken up by parking, roads/sidewalks, entries, open space/landscape, setbacks and buffers




