Petitions	Dale Coker - Burlington Park petition Mr. Coker reported that one of the dual 60-inch culverts under Ephesus Church Rd. at Burlington Park needed attention. The bottom of the right side (or westernmost) pipe on the upstream side has rusted through. He asked the Board to refer the matter to the Town Engineer to evaluate the condition and make the pipe safe to avoid a future wash-out of Ephesus Church Rd.

	Esther Miller - stormwater fee petition		
	Mrs. Miller reported that her stormwater fee is \$144.00. She has a cistern to collect runoff, which she uses to water. No sediment leaves her property. Runoff from the back of her house is collected in a pool, and then goes to a stream. Occasionally, some clear water runs off but no sediment. Mrs. Miller is asking the Board for relief from the stormwater fee.		
	Ms. McClintock asked if the staff could respond to Mrs. Miller's petition.		
	There is no credit mechanism for the stormwater fee. While the fee is based on the amount of impervious area on individual properties, the funds provide community-wide benefits such as infrastructure maintenance and repair, floodplain management, development review, and public education. The only way to reduce the fee is to reduce the amount of impervious area.		
	Ms. McClintock noted that at the Master Plan public hearing, the Town Council was interested in fee credits. Staff indicated that other incentives were suggested for single-family residents such as rain barrel discounts, roof drain disconnects, and riparian buffer restoration; these types of activities could provide a much larger benefit for the community.
