Submittable Software	Jackie Thompson reported that following staff review of the program and discussing our needs we have decided not to move forward with Submittable.		
	After discussion with Orange County and the Town of Carrboro we have decided to maintain the same process for submitting the Outside Agency Application as last year.		
Town of Chapel Hill Pedestrian Safety Pan	Jackie reported that the Plan is finalized and was presented to the Transportation and Connectivity Advisory Board for comment on August 27, 2019. The final plan proposes to use a systemic approach to eliminate future pedestrian involved crashes. The systemic approach is a procedure of using street characteristics, such as presence of sidewalks and pedestrian signals crossing light, to predict high risk road segments or intersections. The approach focuses on analysing the potential of having future accidents rather than the established history of accidents. This approach enables the		

Human Services Survey Results	Town to be more proactive in preventing future pedestrian fatality or injuries on Chapel Hill roads by investing in infrastructure improvement ahead of time. Jackie reported that she sent an email to the five agencies indicated in the Human Services annual survey that spent 20-50 hours completing the survey. Two agencies indicated that it takes time to gather the demographic and budget information, and preparing the attachments. One agency reported

The Coalition is an association of individuals and organization working together to provide housing opportunities for all in Orange County. The Coalition strives to foster collaboration among providers, local government, and advocates to support affordable housing development and preservation in Orange County.		

	Many of the residents that receive assistance from the Coalition providers earn 30-60% of the Area Median Income.
