




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Campus Master Plan - Porthole Alley Vision

Create a gateway to campus, strengthen physical connection between downtown and campus, while enhancing vibrancy and downtown economic development.

Campus Master Plan - Guiding Principals for Porthole Alley

- Maintain ground floor retail presence, while adding office space for Undergraduate Admissions, Visitors Center and other University activities.
- Respect the scale of the block of 100 E. Franklin St. and enhance the existing alley as a part of a pedestrian corridor connecting Franklin Street and Cameron Avenue.
- Strengthen the connection between downtown and the University.
- Be a good neighbor by engaging closely with our current tenants, downtown property owners and merchants, interest groups and the Town of Chapel Hill in a collaborative process.





CONCERNS & RESERVATIONS

ADMISSIONS AT PORTHOLE ALLEY

Porthole Alley is **not representative of the student experience at UNC**. The current location is embedded in the campus landscape and gives prospective students a sense of the campus and what it will be like to be a UNC student. The current admissions arrival experience directs visitors through the campus with **views to the campus greens**.

The Porthole Alley location is **dominated by the downtown**, a lot of concrete and other urban characteristics, and is not representative of campus life. The arrival experience from Rosemary Street parking, through an alley, and across Franklin Street is **not enjoyable or attractive**.

PARKING

Parking on Franklin Street is already a limited resource. The Porthole Alley project – particularly with Admissions here – will **increase demand for parking and reduce availability**.

SCALE AND CHARACTER

The building **should not be a generic 4- or 5-story high rise** like Carolina Square. This scale of building changes the experience of the street and is not integrated with the building fabric of Chapel Hill.

SITE CONTEXT

The **existing buildings, particularly the Hill Building**, are important to the character of Franklin Street.

The United Methodist Church **steeple** is an important focal point.

ADMISSIONS

Re-location of Admissions (and Visitors Center) to Porthole Alley provides the population density to establish a new campus entry, support retail, and promote a vibrant streetscape. Admissions and the Visitors Center share a vision and a critical enthusiasm about the future of Carolina and the importance of its relationship to the town.

UNIVERSITY UNITED METHODIST CHURCH

United Methodist Church and UNC-CH share a long and cooperative relationship. As an immediate neighbor to the site, the Church's daily, varied activities and diverse user groups should be considered a boon to the University's plans for Porthole Alley.

CAROLINA COFFEE SHOP

The Carolina Coffee Shop is – in the minds of the owners and others – more than a business; rather, it is a community center, a local culture, and a memory for generations of alumni. The essence of the Coffee Shop is intimately connected to this particular place. It is uniquely an authentic part of both campus and town that could not be quickly or easily replaced.

PRESERVATION CHAPEL HILL

Preservation on Franklin Street is about the history of the place as a space to meet, shop, and share a common identity.
