• *Mobility and Connectivity Plan Update* – Transportation Staff is proposing to include an upgrade for the proposed facilities along NCDOT roads to compliment the Complete Streets Policy (bike lanes and sidepaths) and reconfigure proposed multiuse paths in the area around Carraway Village. • Ordinance Revision - Transportation Staff is proposing to amend the TOCH ordinance Chapter 12 Article 1 Section 12.2 to allow E-Bikes on Town Greenways.

Greenways, Sidepaths and Parks Projects - Progress: Following are brief updates. Commission members should feel free contact staff if you have any questions or comments.

• *Bolin Creek Trail (East of Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd.)*: Construction and Coal Ash Remediation work is on-going on the portion of the Bolin Creek trail between Martin Luther King, Jr. Blvd. and Bolinwood Dr.

Bridge repair work is complete on the second bridge connecting Bolinwood Drive and the Community Center (see photo on the next page). The Town did provide a 2' wide temporary bridge as an alternative means of connectivity during the bridge closure. The old asphalt trail between Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd. and Bolinwood Drive will also be replaced with a more resilient concrete path.

We anticipate the trail portion of the project will be wrapping up this fall. Please see the <u>Bolin Creek Trail</u> Phase 3A Construction | Town of Chapel Hill, NC webpage.



• Fordham Sidepath Project: Public Works is completing patching on the existing asphalt section of the sidepath by Cleland Drive. Chapelboro featured a story about this work on July 26; to view the article, click here.

Park Planning worked with Transportation and Planning Staff to prepare and post a survey to receive input from stakeholders on two concept plans for traffic calming in the Little Ridgefield Neighborhood. The survey ran through August 21. Staff is reviewing the results with the Project Engineer Staff, will update PGRC members on the results of the survey, and hold a public meeting before the end of the year to inform community members on the project progress and the feedback received through the survey. • Little Free Pantry at Homestead Park: Four Carrboro High School students have completed the little free pantry at Homestead Park. Visitors can now drop off or pick up non-perishable food items and personal supplies. Staff has invited the students to make a presentation to PGRC later this fall. • Playground Replacement at Burlington and North Forest Hills Parks: Staff has received input from community members on vendor's options for the playground equipment and made a recommendation on awarding the contract to the purchasing team. Construction will commence this fall.
