

- Improvements phased-in starting this fall


ADOPT A BLOCK

Changes since last update:

- Funding identified for all but two projects
- DOT approval of art utility boxes requested
- Mulch on S. Columbia replaced

- Hired national consulting firm to design a roadmap for catalyzing the District
 - Limited number of strategic priorities
 - Near-term focus
 - Leverage private investment

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Business plan prepared to establish a Carolina Innovation Hub as the "anchor" of the District
- Deal team review and recommendation to move forward

NEXT STEPS

- Obtained deal team approval of the Innovation hub in Chapel Hill
- Develop an RFP for the Innovation Hub
- Approve lease to allow Innovation Hub opening by January 2022
- Once lease is approved, launch business recruitment outreach to alumni and business, research and NGO partners
