Community Programs: In February, Hargraves Community Center hosted two program series geared towards Black History Month – an African American Movie Series and Celebrating Black History month at the Seymour Senior Center in partnership with Orange County. At the Chapel Hill Community Center, plans for the 33rd year of Webster's Rock the Hill indoor rock-climbing competition are underway, with the event scheduled for March 12-19. Both centers continue to offer out of school time programs including teacher workday camps and community programs.

Homestead Aquatic Center: The facility will reopen from its annual maintenance closure on Fri., March 4. Work completed this year included upgrade to plumbing, replacement of ceiling tiles, cleaning of HVAC returns, deep cleaning and waxing of lobby and locker room floors, and all valves on the main pool filtration system were replaced. Staff is considering moving away from or reducing the current COVID-era reservation system at the pools upon reopening.

<u>Greenways, Sidepaths, and Parks Projects Progress</u>: Following are brief updates. Commission members should feel free to contact the staff if they have any questions or comments.

Community Splash Pad Project – The six sets of qualifications were distributed after the Splash Pad Work Group's meeting on February 22, to the volunteers from the group who offered help evaluate the qualifications and recommend a firm to conduct the feasibility study this spring. A meeting with the evaluation committee members is being scheduled for March. The feasibility study will examine park locations and at least two public housing communities.

Homestead Park Landscaping: Park Maintenance staff removed the stumps of the large crepe myrtle trees cut down by Duke Energy in the fall and amended the beds. The East Chapel Hill Rotary Club plans to install new size-appropriate landscaping at the site this spring. See photos below of the work in progress.



Trail at Trinity Court: New signage has been installed at this refurbished 0.3-mile-long natural surface trail. See photos below.



Umstead Park: A drainage improvement project has been completed around the basketball court area. This work included the addition of a catch basin, improvements to the existing drainage swells and fence repair.
