Shared-Use of Outdoor Public Courts: The Town of Chapel Hill is under contract to add USTA-approved blended pickleball lines on tennis courts 3 and 4 at Ephesus Park and to add a pedestrian gate that will allow pickleball players to move from the pickleball courts to tennis courts 3 and 4 without walking behind the tennis players who are using an

adjacent court. This project will be done by June 30, and the courts could be closed for twelve hours before, during, and after the work is complete. Parks and Recreation staff continues to evaluate spring usage at Ephesus Park to help determine a priority schedule. Currently, tennis usage has priority at all times on tennis courts 1, 2, 3 and 4 at Ephesus Park.

Sports Cafe: Chapel Hill Parks and Recreation's Athletics Team held it first Sports Café meeting on Thursday, May 18, from Noon to 1:00 pm at the Southern Community Park Large Picnic Shelter. Meeting recaps will be shared on the Athletics page at www.chapelhillparks.org.

Teen Center: Parks and Recreation staff along with Public Works staff have prepared the Teen Center for the upcoming repair work that the contractor will oversee for approximately four months. The contractor abating for the asbestos started the week of May 22

<u>Greenways</u>, <u>Sidepaths</u>, <u>and Parks Projects Progress</u>: Following are brief updates. Commission members should contact the staff if they have questions or comments.

Bolin Creek Greenway Umstead to Estes Drive Extension Planning, Community Engagement and Design Project: \$500,000 American Rescue Plan Act funding is in place. This project is being managed by Transportation Planning Division and is proposed to be planned in conjunction with the Estes Drive Extension Project.

Fordham Boulevard Sidepath Project – The renovation and extension of the Fordham Boulevard Sidepath Project is out for construction bids. The bids are due June 8 at 2:00 pm A mandatory pre-bid meeting was conducted in the parking lot at the Rainbow Soccer Fields on May 18 at 9:00 am. This project will provide a multi-modal path along Fordham Boulevard between Cleland Drive and Willow Drive. It is divided into two segments. The southern portion between Cleland Drive and Ridgefield Road involves upgrading the existing asphalt section to concrete. The northern part consists of constructing a new path between Ridgefield Road and Willow Drive along the eastern side of Fordham Boulevard.

Hargraves Park: Award of the \$509,923 construction contract to Salisbury and Moore Construction, Inc. for resurfacing the three Tennis Courts at Hargraves Park was approved by the Town Council's as a consent item on May 24, 2023. Construction will commence in June, and work will be scheduled for 150 days.

Homestead Skate Park: \$500,000 in American Rescue Plan Act funding is in place for the skate park repairs. Staff will be preparing a Request For Qualifications (RFQ) this summer and advertising for companies with experience designing and building skateparks. This work will also include obtaining community feedback.

Inclusive Playground Equipment @ Community Center Place: \$500,000 in American Rescue Plan Act funding is in place for this project. Staff has met with Procurement Team members to discuss the best options for executing this project. A project kick-off will occur this Summer. This work will also include obtaining community feedback.

System-wide Playground Accessibility: \$285,000 in American Rescue Plan Act funding is in place for this project. Staff has met with Procurement Team members to discuss the best options for executing this project.

Teen Center Study: \$65,000 American Rescue Plan Act funding is in place. Staff is in contact with other North Carolina Parks and Recreation Staff about this project and methods they have utilized for initiating a study and their lessons learned. Staff has also created a teen center study team and has created a survey to receive input from other teens in the community. This information has been sent to Chapel Hill Carrboro Highs Schools for distribution and feedback.

Morgan Creek Trail Project

East Section: A contract to finish planning and preliminary design for the East Section of Morgan Creek is being awarded to McAdams, a planning, landscape architecture, and engineering firm. This phase will include a review of alignment options for this section of the greenway and an extensive public engagement process for obtaining input. Opportunities will also have opinions on probable construction costs. A kick-off meeting will be held in June.

West Section: A Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for receiving qualifications for planning, landscape architecture, and engineering firms to finish the planning, preliminary design, and final design documents for constructing the West Section of Morgan Creek Greenway. The RFQ will be advertised in June and posted on the Town's webpage for 30 days. It is anticipated that the award should occur in August.

Tanyard Branch Trail: \$200,000 in American Rescue Plan Act funding is in place for creating a trail connector to Tanyard Branch Affordable Housing Project. This project is being managed by Transportation Planning Division.
