
Affordable Housing & Community Connections

Annual Report Fiscal Year 2022-23











This was the year of building and breakthroughs. We built our team and achieved many milestones to advance the Town Council's affordable housing and equitable community engagement goals. Key highlights in our work over the last year include:

- Bringing UNC Health to the table for the first time to partner with the Town on affordable housing through a <u>historic \$5</u> Million contribution to establish an Affordable Housing Revolving Loan Fund.
- Achieving key policy changes to reduce barriers to affordable housing: <u>expedited review</u>, <u>source of income protection</u>, and <u>housing choices</u>.
- Dedicating \$10 Million to support affordable housing projects in the community, the largest single-year contribution in Town history that will result in 300 new affordable homes in five developments.
- Creating pathways for under-engaged populations to participate in Town government. Close to 200 residents
 participated in programs and engagement opportunities like the <u>Peoples Academy</u>, <u>Summer Youth Employment</u>,
 Community Conversations, and more.
- Leading equity-centered community engagement focused on going out into the community to engage residents and community partners historically under-engaged by the Town. Our team facilitated 215 community meetings, more than double what we accomplished ever before. We compensated residents for their lived experience and provided language interpretation, food, transportation, and other forms of support to reduce barriers to participation.
- Adding four new talented and passionate local government professionals to our team, strengthening our team's capacity to accomplish our department's mission.

I look forward to continuing to work together with residents, community partners, and other Town departments to create more affordable housing opportunities and build a more equitable and inclusive community in Chapel Hill.
