Keith continues to be a leader within the parks and recreation profession due to his amazing contributions and efforts related to adventure programming and outdoor recreation. We are super proud of Keith and the impact of his dedicated service to help grow community here in the Town of Chapel Hill and across the state.









Other Events:

- The Department's Youth Basketball Season started with practices on November 27 and league play started on December 16.
- The annual Climb with Santa Event was held at Chapel Hill Community Center on Saturday, December 9, 2023.
- Parks and Recreation Winter Fest 2023 will be held on Tuesday, December 19 at Hargraves Park Community Center from 11:00 a.m. 12:30 p.m.
 Winter Fest is the Parks and Recreation Departments final meeting of the year for our staff team. The meeting will include a recap of the 2023 year of service, highlight key initiatives for 2024, and celebrate department staff team, including our employees celebrating milestone service years.
- Tennis Community Engagement Meeting will be held on Wednesday, December 20, from 6:00 p.m. 8:00 p.m. at Hargraves Community Center.
- Pickleball Community Engagement Meeting will be held on Thursday, December 21, from 6:00 p.m.- 8:00 p.m. at Chapel Hill Community Center.

Teen Center: Recreation team members continue to assess the current set up of the facility and have started making improvements in anticipation of the facility reopening in early 2024. New furniture has been ordered and contracted work will enhance floor and lighting within the facility..

<u>Greenways, Sidepaths, and Parks Projects Progress</u>: Following are brief updates. Commission members should contact the staff if they have questions or comments.

Bolin Creek Greenway Umstead to Estes Drive Extension Planning, Community Engagement, and Design Project: \$500,000 American Rescue Plan Act funding is in place. The Transportation Planning Division manages this project, which will be planned in conjunction with the Estes Drive Extension Project. A planning and engineering firm has been selected and staff is reviewing their fee proposal.

Fordham Boulevard Sidepath Project: Bids have been received for the renovation and extension of the Fordham Boulevard Sidepath Project. The bids have been rejected since they were over what is allocated for this project. The project team is working with our Business Management Department and Senior Management to review options for additional funding in January 2024.

This project will provide a multi-modal path along Fordham Boulevard between Cleland Drive and Willow Drive. It is divided into two segments. The southern portion between Cleland Drive and Ridgefield Road involves upgrading the existing asphalt section to concrete. The northern part consists of constructing a new path between Ridgefield Road and Willow Drive along the eastern side of Fordham Boulevard.

Hargraves Park Tennis Courts: Construction is in progress to resurface the three existing tennis courts. Work is scheduled for 150 days, which results in a completion date of Friday, April 5, 2024, for this project.

Comprehensive Systemwide Master Plan: \$300,000 from the Penny for Parks funding is in place for this project. A Request For Qualifications (RFQ) has been drafted to find an architecture, engineering, and landscape architect firm to update the 2013 Master Plans for Parks and Greenways. The RFQ will be advertised in January and posted on the Town's webpage for 30 days. The award is expected to occur early next year.

Homestead Skate Park: \$500,000 in American Rescue Plan Act funding is in place for the skate park upgrades. 5th Pocket Skateparks, Inc. is under contract to provide design services for the skate park upgrade project. Their work will include design, construction documents, and specifications for a concrete skatepark. The design work phase will consist of obtaining community feedback. 5th Pocket Skateparks has recently worked with a neighboring jurisdiction on their skatepark project. There will be public meetings to obtain feedback at Homestead Park Skate Park on Monday, December 17, at 2:00 p.m. and on December 18, at 6:00 p.m. at the Chapel Hill Public Library, Meeting Room B. The community engagement phase will continue through the beginning of 2024.

Inclusive Playground Equipment at Chapel Hill Community Center Park: \$500,000 and System-wide Playground Accessibility (\$285,000) in American Rescue Plan Act funding is in place for this project. A meeting was held in September with the playground manufacturer. Staff was able to share input from the community engagement work that occurred when the playground was to be built at the Cedar Falls Park. The company representative has sent 4 renderings and the playground work group met on Monday, December 4 at Chapel Hill Community Center to review the options. Community Engagement will commence February 2024.

Teen Center Study: \$65,000 American Rescue Plan Act funding is in place. Staff is in contact with other parks and recreation agencies regionally and nationally about this project to learn about methods they have applied for launching a study and their lessons learned. Staff created a teen center study team that generated a survey to receive input from teens in the community. This information has been shared with high schools in the Chapel Hill-Carrboro City Schools for distribution and feedback. A Request For Qualifications (RFQ) is currently being drafted and advertising is anticipated for February 2024.

Morgan Creek Trail Project

East Section: The community engagement phase for the planning and design phase of the East Section of Morgan Creek Greenway started in November and will continue through December. The team shared the three options for the trail alignment with the Parks, Recreation, and Greenways Commission on November 21, and has posted an online survey in Burmese, English, Karen, Mandarin Chinese, and Spanish.

There was a Public Meeting at the Chapel Hill Library on December 9, from 11:30 a.m. – 1:00 p.m. with approximately 20 people in attendance. The project team received feedback and will be sharing notes from the meeting on the project webpage.

Staff will also host a December 14 site meeting from 12:30 p.m. – 3: 30 p.m. at the Morgan Creek Greenway parking lot and hold virtual office hours on Thursday, December 14 from 4:00 – 5:00 p.m. and Friday, December 15 from 9:30 – 11:30 a.m. to meet individually with public members.

West Section: We have completed the selection process for hiring planning, landscape architecture, and engineering firm to finish the planning design, community engagement, permitting, and construction documents for the West Section of Morgan Creek Greenway. A fee proposal has been requested from the selected firm, and a contract should be awarded by January 2024.

Tanyard Branch Trail: \$200,000 in American Rescue Plan Act funding is in place for creating a trail connector to the Tanyard Branch Affordable Housing Project. Transportation Planning Division is managing this project.
