Re: Quarterly status report for the quarter ended March 31, 2024

The third quarter of the 2023-2024 fiscal year included the following highlights:

- 1. We sold 1 new inclusionary unit at the new Bridgepoint development. This 4-bedroom home is one of the largest in CHT inventory. The buyer is a single dad with three children.
- 2. We attended eleven outreach events and held three one-on-one financial counseling sessions and one homebuyer education class.
- 3. We launched the "Budget Your Way Home" program
- 4. Council member Karen Stegman held a session for homeowners to answer questions about public service.

One home was sold requiring no additional subsidy. The buyer's AMI was 76%, household income was \$76,432 and the purchase price of the home was 150,000. This is one of the largest homes in our inventory and a brand-new home in the Bridgepoint community in Chapel Hill. As of March 31, 2023, there were 281 homes in our ownership inventory.

**3** One-on-one financial counseling sessions and **1** homebuyer education class was held assisting first time homebuyers with their planning to purchase a home.

We launched the "Budget Your Way Home" program. The pilot "Budget Your Way Home" program will serve applicants who are ready to buy a home but face barriers to qualifying for a mortgage, such as inadequate savings, low credit scores, and unstable incomes. The program combines monthly financial education with individual coaching from CHT's HUD-certified counselors over six months.
