He works at Fire Station #4 in the Operations Division, which responds to emergencies including fires, fire alarms and EMS calls. He is in charge of the station, truck and crew for his shift (there are three 24-hour shifts). He is pleased that they just got a truck equipped with all rescue tools and an onboard air system to refill breathing bottles.

Byron is a member of an Urban Search and Rescue (USAR) team that includes Chapel Hill, Durham, Raleigh and Cary. They participate in monthly training and respond to major events like building explosions and plane crashes.

Byron is in charge of rope rescue equipment for the Town and the USAR team. He also oversees the firefighter accountability program, which makes sure that all firefighters at a scene are accounted for.

He enjoys giving fire safety talks to children at schools, churches, day care centers and birthday parties. He says that he is fortunate to work with good people and good crews.

Firefighters are famous for their excellent cooking, and Byron is one of the best. He was invited to teach a cooking class at Southern Season in June 2010, and he will teach another class on Feb. 15, featuring Cincinatti style chili and cornbread.
