


Town Population by Age Group


Orange County Population by Race


Chapel Hill Population - People of Color





Percent of Children in Poverty





Food Insecurity Rate by County (2015)




Percent of Children Living in Food Insecure Homes


Percent of Eligible Children Actually Getting Free and Reduced Price School


Percent of Students Enrolled in Free and Reduced Lunch, 2015-2016

Percent of Eligible Chilren Actually Getting Free Summer Meals








Percent Change in District Graduation Rates between 2006 and 2016


Economically Disadvantaged Student Graduation Rate Improvement




Adult Smoking Rates

Compared to Adjacent and Peer Communities




Adult Obesity


Drug Overdose Deaths per 100,000


Excessive Drinking








2016 ACCRA Cost of Living Housing Index








2016 Homeless Count Demographics








Total Chapel Hill Transit Ridership (in millions), FY2004- FY2017




